**Location:** The Michigan Flywheelers Museum is located at 6285 68th St., South Haven, MI. From South Haven, take Phoenix Road east 2.3 miles to Fideland FunPark. Turn south on 68th street, then 1/2 mile on east side of 68th.

**Purpose:** To educate children about our American farming history.
